Diagnosis	Results statements that describe, explain, or predict some aspect of the child's, parent's or family's experience of coming to know the child's diagnosis; results focusing on the time period surrounding the diagnosis. Cross code with other relevant categories (e.g., parent experience)
Demographics	Results statements that link age, gender, ethnicity, education, SES, and/or employment to family, parent, child, or condition factors. Do not code when the demographic variable is a control variable. Smokers vs. non-smokers in household for asthma sample.
